ECKMAN FARM – This 2 lot subdivision was presented by Ed Jefferis. The township engineer's letter still had some open issues to be resolved regarding trees and monument markers. Ed Jefferis reported that he would request two waivers. 1. Waiver from Section 501.K.6 regarding trees with caliper of 6" or greater and 2. Waiver from Section 617.A. & B regarding monuments being shown at the boundary markers. No planning modules were required and no E & S proposed.

MULTI MUNICIPAL – Charlie informed the Planning Commission of the discussions held at the Multi Municipal meeting on February 25, 2010. The County had an advisor give a presentation on opportunities to develop commercial area along the Route 1 and Baltimore Pike corridor.

PRODUCE AUCTION – The farmers involved have been looking at other locations.
