UPPER OXFORD TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION MAY 5, 2014

The Upper Oxford Township Planning Commission held their regular monthly meeting at the township building, 1185 Limestone Road, Oxford, PA at 7:00 P.M. on Monday, May 5, 2014.

Members present: Christine Nibouar, Sam Reyburn, David Underwood, Harold Bryson and Karl Herr.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by the Chairman, Christine Nibouar.

MINUTES – Motion was made by David Underwood, seconded by Harold Bryson and carried to approve the April 7, 2014 Minutes with the following corrections:

"April 7, 2014 Minutes – Motion was made by Karl Herr, seconded by Harold Bryson And carried to approve the waiver for the Esh Preliminary Plan".

AMOS ESH – Application for a NPDES permit was reviewed for completeness on 4/14/14. We are still waiting to hear from DEP and Chester County Conservation District. Karl Herr questioned whether or not Mr. Esh would be required to file a nutrient management plan.

LEVI GLICK – Ron Ragan is checking with the township Solicitor regarding the private lane on these properties and will report back to the Planning Commission.

CAPPELLI PLANNING MODULE – The Township received a revision for the approved Planning Module from Evan Mill Environmental. This will be brought before the Board of Supervisors at their May 12th meeting.

REMO TOTO PROPERTY - Scott Rugen discussed with the Planning Commission the property located at Route 896 and Route 1 owned by Remo Toto. Mr. Toto has a sign advertising building sizes incorrectly. However, after researching, Betsy and Scott found that there are three lots owned by Mr. Toto and a building in that zone could be in excess of 40,000 square feet.

LINCOLN UNIVERSITY – Scott mentioned to the Planning Commission if they were aware of the Keystone Opportunity Zone at Lincoln. This project is in Lower Oxford Township who will need to rezone to allow this activity. The small section in Upper Oxford Township is in the C-1 Zone. One issue of concern for Upper Oxford is the impact of traffic at Route 896 and Baltimore Pike.

BILLBOARD – Scott mentioned that Lower Oxford Township is intending to erect an 800 square foot electronic billboard.

ADJOURNMENT – There being no further business, motion was made by Harold Bryson, seconded by Dave Underwood and carried unanimously to adjourn at 7:30 P.M.
