Working Supervisors:

All three Supervisors are affirmed to work on roads if needed; request Auditors' approval of \$12.00/hr for other road work and \$12.00/hr. for snow equipment operations. Recommend to Auditors that Supervisors be reimbursed \$.56.5, the current IRS rate per mile to attend Road Inspections and Seminars.

Road Crew Benefits:

7 paid holidays – New Year's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas

6 paid sick days – may be accumulated up to 24 days

3 days for bereavement leave – immediate family and 1 day for near relative

2 personal days per year

Paid Vacation

After 1 year -5 days and 2-1/2 days per year for each successive year up to 20 days. Only 5 days may be carried forward to the following year and must be used in that year.
